- Moving forward with the renovation of PC.
- AC & electric are on; mansard is encapsulated; rubber roofing to be completed; smell is gone; cable trays are going up for low voltage sound system; conduit is done, insulation is going in, and wallboard will go up next week.

- A/V sound system is in process:
- TVs will be in Matthew/Mark/Luke/John/Music Room with wall mounted platform and shelf for a blue-ray DVD player. TVs will be in PC2. These will also be used for video streaming for special holidays (after the church is built) Speakers will be installed in all rooms.
- Previous audio equipment was cleaned by ServePro and is currently in storage. New equipment will be installed in the church. Fr. Paul would like to use our previous equipment for the school.
- The Parish Center was to be completed by Sept 1<sup>st</sup>, but with some unexpected delays (i.e., sewer break, RG&E hookup), we are now looking at the middle to the end of October, if there are no other delays.

#### **Meeting with Bishop Matano: Brian Porter & Fr. Paul**

Bernard Grizard, Fr. Paul, and Brian Porter met with Bishop Matano and Fr. White. Meeting went extremely well, and there were no expectations from the Bishop that we didn't already know.

- Bishop Matano pledged his support & all necessary resources for a capital campaign as long as we go through the process.
- Size of the church has not been determined yet but what is definite is that the Bishop wants the church to be Catholic, have a sacred space for prayer, and possibly the tabernacle centered.
- Msgr. Moroney accepted the position of our Liturgical Consultant, and Bishop Matano thought he was an excellent choice.



- Msgr. Moroney has a great sense of liturgy, good sense about the people (recommended listening sessions), and he works well with the Bishop.

**Finances: Lisa Cecere**

- The Finance Subcommittee reviewed Jamie Ott's financial statements and felt that they were not clear enough.
- Lisa put together a summary report of the Parish Center only. She would like to see this for the entire project including Nichols budget & extra expenses (i.e., worship guides-Staples, gym floor, etc.).

**Parish Listening Sessions: Betsy McDermott**

- Betsy put together a summary of the Parish Listening Sessions - pulled from the flip charts, her notes, and what she gleaned from the sessions.
- Betsy reviewed the summary and the Committee added the following comments:
  - easily identified restrooms;
  - many references to St. Matthews but no references to the outside of the church;
  - extended area for handicapped accessibility space to accommodate family seating (integrate into the assembly).
- It is encouraging that everyone seems to be on the same page.
- Conclusion:
  1. Most comments fit in the guidelines except auditorium seating.
  2. Community is really important to this church.
- Fr. Paul and Brian received many positive comments, written & spoken, on Betsy's running of the listening sessions.
- This is a good summation for the Bishop to see.
- Need to reach out to special interest groups:
  - Fr. Paul will meet with the Parish Office staff on Sept. 16<sup>th</sup> to get their input.
  - Meet with other special interest groups, such as young families, youth, school, teachers, catechists, faith formation, councils, etc.
  - New Special Interest Subcommittee was formed: Fr. Paul, Betsy McDermott, and Diane Porter.

**Church Designs: Brian Porter**

- Brian presented more ideas on the church design.
- We need to keep in mind that the Bishop wants a permanent structure as a Catholic church for generations to come.

**Whole Campus Subcommittee: Jim O'Reilly**

- Jim O'Reilly, Bernie Iacovangelo, John Butler, Katie Butler, and Bob Malone are members of the Whole Campus Subcommittee.
- Bishop Matano expects that we're going to build a rectory for future priests.
