TOP TEN GUIDELINES FOR WEDDING LECTORS AT ST. PIUS CHURCH

- 1. Pray to God that this ministry will praise his name and bless the people. Pray through the text; let God's word soak into your heart. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in the proclamation.
- 2. Set aside time at home to prepare yourself. Speak aloud the passage to yourself and listen for where the pauses and emphasizes are in the reading.
- 3. Pick out the most important sentence or phrase. Try to communicate it above all else.
- 4. Look up all the words proper names usually that are unfamiliar to you. Be sure you know their meaning and how to pronounce them.
- 5. Rehearse several times any Scripture passages with run-on sentences or any text where the meaning is apt to be lost to listeners.
- 6. Approach the Ambo as reverently as you would approach the Altar. Christ is present in God's word and Eucharist, the "two tables" of the liturgy.
- 7. Don't announce the reading as "the first reading is..." or "the second reading is..."
- 8. Don't speak too slowly or too quickly.
- 9. Don't lean on the Ambo or crane your neck to get to the microphone. The microphone is very powerful and will pick up your voice provided you speak at a normal level.
- 10. Don't get flustered if you make a mistake. Even the best public speakers make mistakes, pause a second and regain your composure, then keep going. Don't repeat the passage.
